Students were delighted and joyfully partook in all activities.



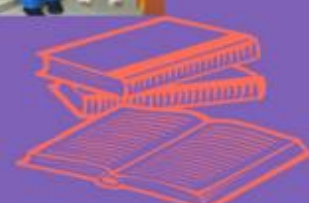
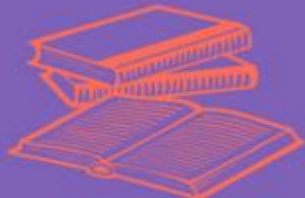

29-09-2023



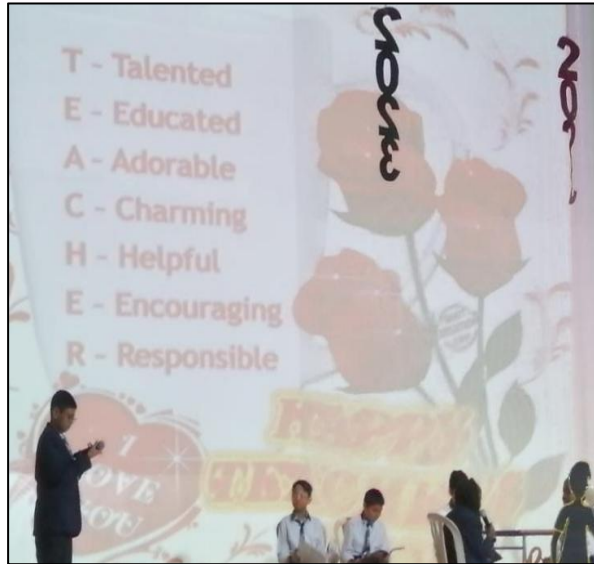
World Heart Day is observed and celebrated annually on September 29 with the aim of increasing awareness of cardiovascular diseases and how to control them to negate their global impact.

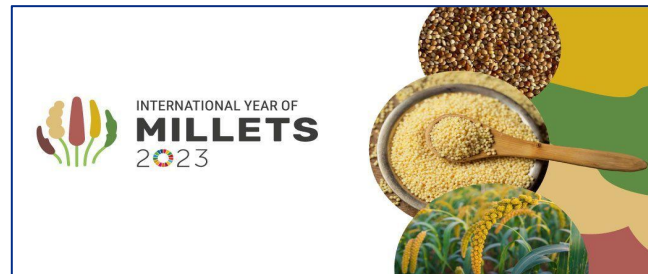
