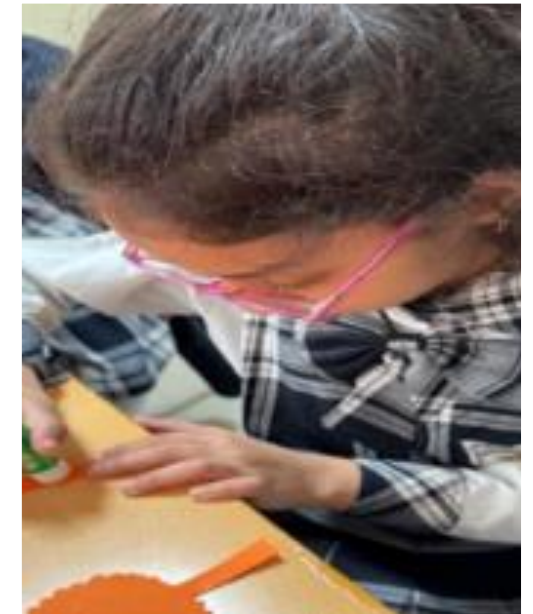
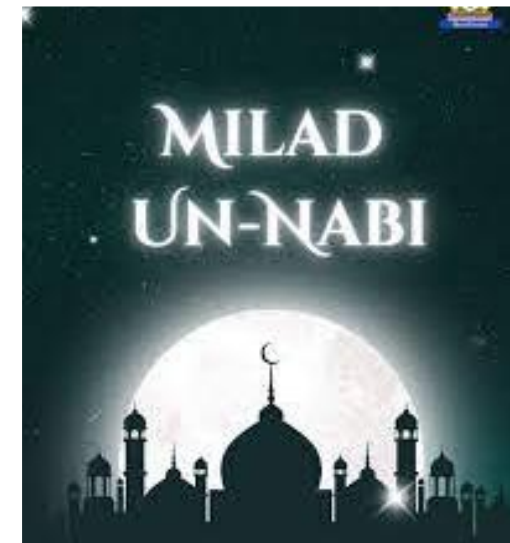

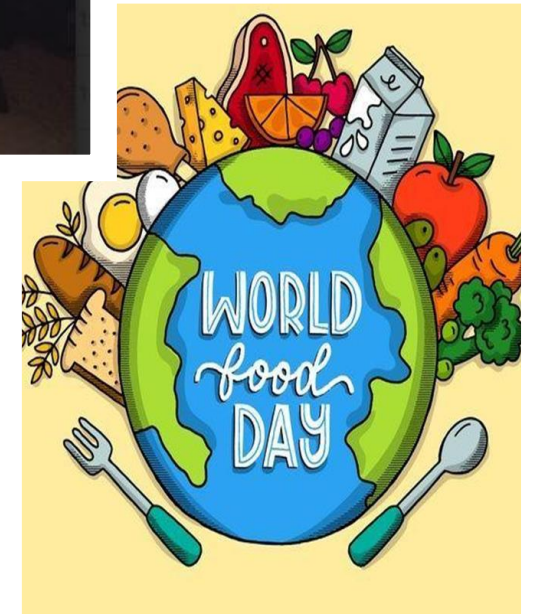
Wednesday, 15th October 2025

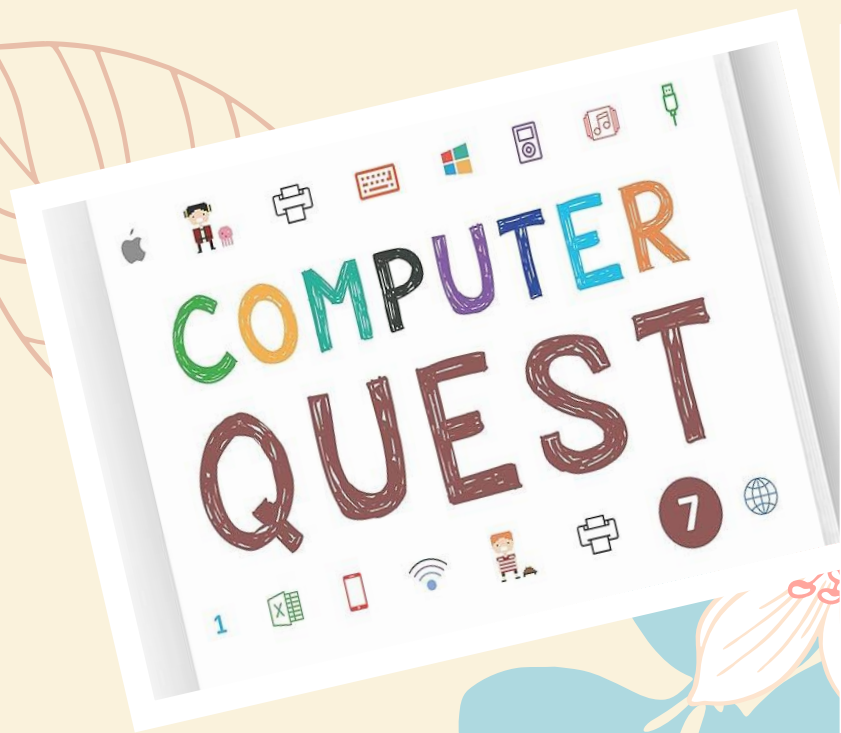

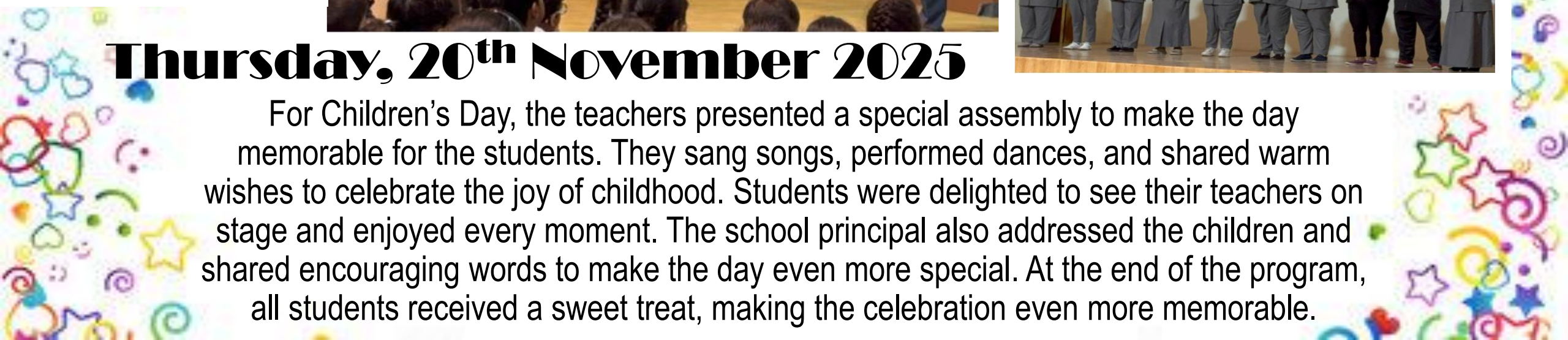
